

## **Projects Funded in November 2017**

Neighborhood Connections, with additional funding from Cuyahoga Arts & Culture, will support 65 projects in Cleveland and East Cleveland with grants totaling \$195,660. The following details each project, the grant amount, and the neighborhood where the project will take place.

Projects marked with an asterisk (\*) are co-funded by the residents of Cuyahoga County through Cuyahoga Arts & Culture.

Bellaire Puritas	\$2,500	<b>Hasani Management, Inc.*</b> received \$2,500 to hold a garden camp from spring to through autumn consisting of fun, educational and entertaining curriculum for the youth.
Buckeye	\$4,000	<b>Keeping It Together on 118th</b> was awarded \$4,000 for a community hands on holiday workshop to build and assemble new address plaques and the installation of solar lamp posts for each home on the street.
Central	\$2,500	<b>Family Wellness Network</b> was awarded \$2,500 for Eath Healthy - Be Active. A series of community workshops to raise awareness about developing and maintaining healthy lifestyles.
Central	\$2,500	<b>Grace Temple COGIC</b> was awarded \$2,500 for Feeding the Community. Funds will be used to create an expanded hot meals program, a food pantry, and a computer resource room.
Central	\$3,500	<b>John Cullum Renegades</b> were awarded \$3,500 for the JCR Cheerleaders & Dance Squad. Funds will be used for cheerleading and dance team uniforms, trophies, and squad appreciation events.

Central	\$3,000	<b>Mt. Sinai Youth</b> was awarded \$3,000 for All for One and One for All. A program to provide free sports clinics and dance classes to youth to improve self-esteem and physical fitness.
Central	\$3,000	<b>Stepstone Academy</b> was awarded \$3,000 for the 2017-2018 Yearbook. Funds will be used to expand the yearbook to include student requested segments and provide free copies to students and their families.
Central	\$2,200	<b>The Blanket Project</b> was awarded \$2,200 for THE BLANKET PROJECT. A group sewing activity for children to sew blankets for themselves and children in transitional housing.
Central	\$3,000	<b>Woodland Cemetery Foundation of Cleveland*</b> was awarded \$3,000 for Heritage in Central Cemetary. Funds will be used to create a historical coloring book and train historic reenactors to lead tours around Junteenth.

Mt. Pleasant	\$5,000	<b>Empowered Learning Network</b> was awarded \$5,000 for digital literacy. Funds will be used to provide technology training to neighborhood residents.
Mt. Pleasant	\$2,000	Gamma Delta Zeta Helping Others Incorporated was awarded \$2,000 for the Stork's Nest. A program to help encourage healthy behaviors during pregnancy though incentives and education.
Mt. Pleasant	\$3,000	<b>St. Peter's A.M.E. Zion Church*</b> was awarded \$3,000 for their after-school program to assist youth with homework and provide art, music, dance, and other cultural experience.
North Collinwood	\$3,000	<b>Apples of Gold Childcare Center</b> was awarded \$3,000 for Literacy Through Music Education. Funds will be used to put on a free community recital to showcase the talents of local children and youth.

North Collinwood	\$3,824	<b>Restoring Cleveland 4U</b> was awarded \$3,824 fir Step Up to Grow. A program to provide affordable landscaping by volunteer professionals who will be taught landscaping skills on the job.
North Collinwood	\$4,000	Say What!!!* was awarded \$4,000 for Say What!!! A weekly radio show for and by teen girls to discuss issues that affect their daily lives.
North Collinwood	\$5,000	<b>Twelve Literary and Performative Arts Incubator*</b> was awarded \$5,000 for One Mic Open Poetry Slam Fellowship. A fellowship to train youth aged 14 - 19 in the art of poetry and performance.
Ohio City	\$1,536	<b>Friends of Greenwood Park</b> received \$1,536 to plant flowers, hold yoga classes and host a basketball tournament in Greenwood Park.
Old Brooklyn	\$2,500	<b>Historical Society of Old Brooklyn*</b> was awarded \$2,500 to provide a storefront museum to the community by displaying pictures and historical artifacts.
Shaker Square	\$3,750	<b>Buckeye Movers and Shakers</b> was awarded \$3,750 to host a series of family focus groups and workshops designed to address issues of violence within the neighborhood.
Shaker Square	\$1,000	<b>Larchmere Porchfest</b> received \$1,000 to promote and provide music and the arts on neighborhood porches throughout the Larchmere neighborhood and beyond.
Slavic Village	\$4,119	<b>Another Chance of Ohio</b> received \$4,119 to provide personal care items such as soap, laundry detergent, deodorant, lotion, toothpaste, toothbrushes to neighborhood residents that cannot be purchased with government assistance.
Slavic Village	\$5,000	Broadway Comanches Youth Mentoring & Sports Association was awarded \$5,000 to purchase new equipment and recondition existing football equipment for neighborhood youth football team.
Slavic Village	\$3,000	<b>P-16 Safety Initiative</b> was awarded \$3,000 to purchase and distribute porch lights and LED lights for residents to "Light Up the Village" during the morning school commute and after school commute providing safety and security to students.

Slavic Village	\$3,000	<b>Rooms to Let</b> received \$3,000 to feature 4 homes in which neighborhood artists will install their work. The event will also feature a neighborhood block party with live musical performances and hands-on art activities.
Slavic Village	\$2,500	<b>Silver Connections</b> was awarded \$2,500 to provide information and resources on topics including dementia, nutrition, holistic health, caregiver awareness, stress management, and other social supports.
Slavic Village	\$1,550	<b>Women's Wellness Foundation</b> received \$1,550 to host a job fair highlighting non-traditional jobs for women, particularly those with obstacles to employment, such as felony convictions and educational barriers.
South Collinwood	\$2,220	<b>Getting Our Babies to College 101</b> was granted \$2,220 to conduct an interactive workshop for families designed to assist with the college prep process.
South Collinwood	\$5,000	<b>Lady Bound</b> was awarded \$5,000 for books, transportation to events and a yearend trip to the African American History Museum in Detroit, Michigan to help in the development of leadership skills.
Stockyards	\$4,700	<b>Fenwick Block Club</b> was granted \$4,700 to revitalize the community garden and grassy area along the highway fence into a functional green space for residents' recreation and relaxation.
Stockyards	\$2,915	<b>Village People</b> was awarded \$2,915 to create and build a wall of lattice fences surrounding community gardens within the neighborhood to prevent trespassing and destruction of vegetables.
Stockyards	\$2,362	<b>W. 73rd Community Coalition</b> was awarded \$2,362 to conduct a community potluck gathering to offer paper products and a main dish while neighbors provide side dishes and desserts.
pUnion Miles	\$2,000	<b>Present Truth Advent Ministries</b> was awarded \$2,000 to provide program materials and educational seminars to families of loved ones fighting drug addictions.
University	\$2,500	<b>Theatre in the Circle</b> was granted \$2,500 to put on a series of musical performances such as "The All-Night Strut" featuring songs of the 1930's and 40's, along with a production of "Love Letters" and "Nunsense A-Men!".
Westown	\$2,000	<b>Neighbors Helping Neighbors Block Club</b> received \$2,000 to assist seniors, and those who are disabled in maintaining their properties. Services provided will included lawncare, light landscaping and the upkeep of flower beds.
Westown	\$1,310	Westown Volunteer Committee* was awarded \$1,310 to host a Holiday Family Event which include music, arts and crafts, free ice skating and skate rental, food, gifts and a family photo with Santa.
