Your Project Summary: Children and siblings, grandparents, parents and friends will learn a variety of art techniques and create together. We will have a show at the end to exhibit the work.

Final Score: Somewhat. Overall, the panel felt that the applicant provided some evidence throughout the application that the funding criteria were met.

CAC Grant Amount: \$4,000

To ensure an impartial and transparent application review process, CAC convened an online panel of arts and cultural professionals from outside the region who evaluated and scored eligible applications.

Below you will find the panel's scores and any feedback in response to the question: **With an emphasis on public benefit, does the applicant demonstrate evidence that it meets CAC's three funding criteria?**

Note: Panelist scores and comments are presented in no particular order.

Panelist 1

Score: Somewhat

Applicant provides some evidence that criteria can be met, but definition of community is lacking- are project leads part of the community? Budget numbers are adequate, support materials could be stronger.

Panelist 2

Score: Yes

This project meets the criteria, displaying Public Benefit in many aspects. EEPMA adequately grasps their community. The project is free and accessible to the public. EEPMA's simple yet deferential statement, "We want to make sure that residents have access to quality arts programming without concern for cost," exemplifies a respect for its community and its willingness to work with it to respond to its needs. The collaborative, intergenerational classes will encourage meaningful relationship building. This project exhibits Artistic and Cultural Vibrancy through inspiring and challenging community members to think in new ways. The application shows ample support for Organizational Capacity.
