Your Project Summary: This is a sixteen-week photography program that will teach students the basics and fundamentals of analog film photography. By learning these traditional photography methods, students will be able to use these skills to portray their own visual interpretations of the world around them.

Final Score: No. Overall, the panel felt that the applicant provided insufficient evidence throughout the application that the funding criteria were met.

Panelist 1

Score: No

What are the demographics of the students? There was some thoughts pertaining to "tolerance for diverse ideas." I would have liked more information about the students you are serving and how this is beneficial to the community of Parma Heights.

Panelist 2

Score: No

The opportunity for youth to gain skills in analog photography is very interesting, however, I wish to have a better understanding of the community this programming serves. The emphasis on youth voice is strong, but I would like to see more detail about the relationship with the community partner. I would also like to learn more about the diversity and qualifications of the staff, parents, teachers, and volunteers in the program. The budget, goal, and evaluation strategy are not specific enough and need attention. The supplemental materials do not follow the guidelines. That said, as a newly incorporated organization, I think there is potential here.
